



ADMISSION.

The Academy is free to all students from the country. For the present no fee will be charged students coming from beyond the country.

Students will be admitted on the following conditions:—

Those who have already passed the entrance examination to any of the High Schools or County Academies, and those holding Teachers' Licenses or Provincial Normal School Diplomas, will be admitted without further examination. All others will be required to pass an examination on the following subjects:

(1) Grammar. Prescribed text book, omitting notes and more difficult matter in small print.

(2) Geography. Outlines of Physical Geography, with first six problems on the Globe. British Empire, advanced text book.

(3) History of British America. British History, including main divisions of periods. Sovereigns, with names, descent and character. Prominent events in each reign. Names and deeds of noted individuals and detailed knowledge of Victoria's reign.

(4) Arithmetic, as in Kirkland and Scott. Algebra, four fundamental rules.

(5) Useful Knowledge, a paper containing questions on useful knowledge as embraced in the Common School Course.

The entrance examination will be held on October 28th and 29th, 1891, and April 27th and 28th, 1892.

Candidates who can show sufficient reason for not being present at the regular examination may, at the discretion of the Principal or faculty, be admitted to a supplementary examination at such times as may be determined upon.
