MEASURE TO PROVIDE FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF PRODUCTIVE EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Mr. Broadbent: I want to be brief because a number of points have already been made, but certainly the members of our party believe that the bill, which we supported in a very fulsome way at the outset, has taken on a somewhat different tone, particularly as evidenced by the emphasis in the supporting speeches of the minister. We supported this bill at the outset, Mr. Speaker, because in our view there are now two major problems in Canada and both are concerned with poverty; one is regional poverty and the other is poverty within the regions of Canada associated with class or occupational groupings.
