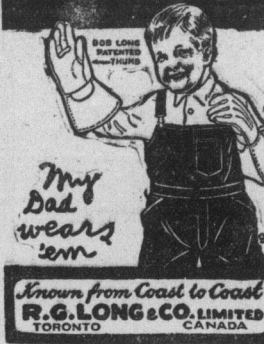
"How do you know about them?" interrupts Dycart with a curious start. "Who told you—who—I mean," controlling himself by a supreme effort, "how did you know they were living here?"

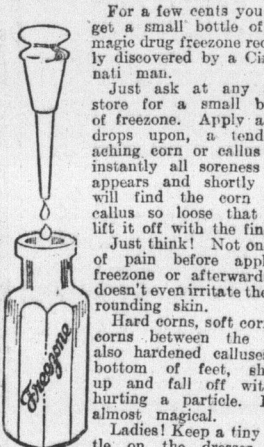
