And the said Resolution was agreed to.

The House, according to Order, proceeded to take into further consideration the Twenty-third Resolution which was, on Wednesday, the 9th April instant, reported from the Committee of Supply, and which Resolution was then postponed; and the same was again read, as followeth :---

23. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Thirty-two thousand dollars be granted to Her Majesty, for the expenses of Government in the North West Territories, including printing, roads, bridges, ferries and aid to schools, for the year ending 30th June, 1885.

And the said Resolution was agreed to.

The House, according to Order, proceeded to take into further consideration the Twelfth and Twenty-sixth Resolutions which were, on Wednesday, the 9th April instant, reported from the Committee of Supply, and which Resolutions were then postponed; and the same were again read, as followeth :--

12. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Forty-seven thousand eight hundred and eighty dollars be granted to Her Majesty, to defray the following expenses in connection with Legislation, House of Commons:—To cover expenditure for additional stationery, \$5,000; to cover expenditure for French translation during recess, \$1,000; to cover amount necessary to complete the publication of the Debates of the Session of 1884, under increased expenditure authorized by House last Session, \$16,000; to meet additional expenses of witnesses, shorthand reporters, &c., in connection with Select Committees, \$1,000; to meet additional expenditure in connection with Select Committees, \$2,000; ro met additional expenditure in connection with the Sessional Messengers, \$2,000; ro met additional expenditure in connections, \$20,000; to cover extra claims of certain Returning Officers at the last General Elections, \$2,000; to F. S. Bastien, to reimburse him for candidate's nomination deposit returned to candidate, \$200; to pay Hon. Mr. Vail \$232, and Mr. Robertson (Hastings) \$256, balance due them on account of Sessional Indemnity, 1882-83, and to Mr. Colby the amount which will otherwise be deducted from his allowance, on account of his absence during the present Session, \$192, for the year ending 30th June, 1884.

26. Resolved, That a sum not exceeding Forty-eight thousand one hundred and eighty dollars and sixty-nine cents be granted to Her Majesty, to defray the following expenses in connection with Welland Canal, viz.:—To purchase a steam pump, \$5,000; services of Watchmen on Canal, \$7,000; to pay for the damages to the cargo and hull of the Schooner "St. Andrews," \$16,555.95; to pay for damages to the cargo of the "Jennie Graham," \$19,624.74, for the year ending 30th June, 1884.

The Twelfth Resolution was agreed to.

The first three items of the Twenty-sixth Resolution were agreed to.

And the Question being put, That this House doth agree with the Committee in the last item (to pay for damages to the cargo of the "Jennie Graham," \$19,624.74); the House divided: and it was resolved in the Affirmative.

The said Resolution was then agreed to.

The House, according to Order, proceeded to take into further consideration the Seventh Resolution which was, on Wednesday, the 9th April instant, reported from the Committee of Supply, and which Resolution was then postponed; and the same was again read, as followeth :--
