WHITNEY, Lieut.-Col. JAMES PLINY, Q.C. (Dundas).

Ancestor, Henry Whitney, came to America from Herefordshire, Eng., in 1640. S. of Richard Leet Whitney and Clarissa Jane Whitney. B. at Williamsburg, Co. of Dundas, Ont., 2 Oct., 1843. Was an unsuccessful candidate for present seat at g. e., 1886. First returned to Leg. Assen. 31 Jan., 1888, on the sitting mem., Dr. Chamberlain's election being declared void for bribery by agents. Reelected at g. e., 1890 and 1894. Has been the Leader of the Opposition since April, 1896. A Liberal Conservative.—Morrisburg.

WILLOUGHBY, WILLIAM ARSON, M.D. (East Northumberland).

S. of Geo. H. Willoughby, who was a descendant of the Devonshire Willoughbys, and a native of Irel., and came to Can. about 1838. B. in the Tp. of West Gwillimbury, Co. of Simcoe, 2 Feb., 1844. Ed. at the Bradford Grammar School., and graduated M.D. at Victoria Coll. in 1867. A mem. for eight years of the Colborne Municipal Council. and seven years its Reeve, and a member for nine years of the School Board. Was Warden of the United Counties of Northumberland and Durham in 1884. Is a surgeon of the 40th Batt. V.M. First returned to Leg. Assem. at g.e., 1886. Being unseated on petition, a new election took place I Feb., 1888, at which he was an unsuccessful candidate. On the death of the sitting mem., Mr. Clarke, a new election took place, 11 Oct., 1888, when he was re-elected. Re-elected at g. e., 1890 and 1896. A Conservative. Cal. borne, Ont.
