MERRITT, THOMAS RODMAN. [*Lincoln.*] 2ND MEM.

Youngest s. of the late Hon. W. H. Merritt, the projector of the Welland Canal, who sat in the L. A., Can., for many years, was a mem. of the Ex. Council, and at the time of his death represented Niagara division in Leg. Council, Can.; and grands. of Thos. Merritt, a U. E.
