Item It to oppose the Apartheid Regime in South Africa, the SU removed Rothman tobacco products from all SU outlets, (June 27, 1978); Re-endorsed January 3, 1982. Item 2: in recognition of "the repressive and violent nature of the junta that controls El Salvador," the SU "called upon the Canadian Government to oppose all foreign military intervention in El Salvador." (December 8, 1981).

Item 3: to oppose the imposition of martial law in Poland, the SU sent a telegram of protest to the Polish Embassy in Ottawa demanding "the

release of the jailed unionists and their supporters...." (February 2, 1982).

Considering the three items stated above, the SU our taken a stand above, the SU our taken a stand thereby has set a precedent for taking action and issuing statements. The Ammar/Chomyn motion, therefore, is not beyond SU jurisdiction. The motion can and should be carried.
