Macrae into the charges laid by you against the teacher shows him to be unfit for the position and the Department would like you to notify him immediately that his services are no longer required, and you will be good enough to consult with the Public School Inspector with a wise to obtaining the services of a duly qualified teacher to take charge of this school. The names of all applicants together with certificates and testimonials are to be submitted to the Department.
