Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 16th instant, and in reply to that portion in which you refer to the prospect of getting some young Indians to attend the Agricultural School and Experimental Farm at Truro, N.S., I beg to say that the Department is in hearty sympathy with your efforts and would be prepared to assist financially in ~~admission~~ ~~admission~~ a few young men to take this course.

The Department is not conversant with the course of studies nor with the fees charged at this institution, but has knowledge of the conditions at the Ontario Agricultural College and Experimental Farm at Guelph. At the latter institution the fees are very reasonable and energetic and willing young men have means of making almost all their expenses by working during the college term and during the recess.

The greatest care should be taken by you in choosing young men for recommendation to the Department, as only those who will make determined efforts to succeed and who, you think, will prove a credit to the officials of the Department should be selected. Then too they should have a
