Sir,

The teacher of the St. Regis Island School reports that the building was entered sometime between Friday evening, November 25th, and Saturday, November 26th. The window frame was cut and damage done to the interior of the building.

I have to ask you to be good enough when you next visit St. Regis to make inquiries into this matter. If you do not find it convenient to visit the Island yourself you should, if you think circumstances justify it, authorize somebody else to make inquiries. It might be well for you to notify the teacher, Miss Elizabeth E. Gallagher, to meet you, if convenient, in the village. The Department is of opinion that in a case of this kind the guilty person should be punished, if it is possible to ascertain his identity.
