Post-War Policy

The national objectives suggested in the Resolutions of the Liberal Federation are:

1. National security through international co-operation;
2. Productive and remunerative employment for all who are able to work;
3. Protection of the health of the people and social insurance on an adequate scale.

These objectives might appropriately be set out in the speech from the throne and made the focus of a statement on post-war policy.

They have the merit of putting international co-operation into the forefront of post-war policy. The greater stress the government places on the international aspect of post-war planning the greater its advantage will be over its political opponents, who have given little attention to this field and who have no experience in international affairs.

At the same time, care should be taken to avoid giving the impression that the government is counting too much on external developments and is not making specific plans in the domestic field.
