Q. And you were in the hospital until the 2nd of October; is that correct?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. What did you do after you were discharged from the hospital?

A. After I was discharged from the hospital I was given a route letter to the unit from which I originally went absent without leave.

Q. Where is that?

A. Brampton, Ontario, sir.

Q. Did you proceed to Brampton?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. When did you get to Brampton?

A. Approximately nine o'clock the next morning.

Q. Nine o'clock October 3?

A. That's correct.
