## NEW EDINBURGH.

A village in the township of Gloucester and county of Carleton, at the confluence of Rideau and Ottawa rivers, adjoining the city of Ottawa. The Rideau river here is the boundary between Ottawa and New Edinburgh, and falls into the Ottawa over a limestone ledge, a perpendicular height of nearly 50 feet, forming a curtain, whence the name Rideau was derived. Rideau Hall, the residence of the Governor General, is within the corporated limits. The McKay estate of over 1000 acres, the greater portion of which has been well preserved and laid out as a private park would form from the variety of soil and foliage, attractive seats for suburban residences. The Rideau Falls afford splendid water powers on which extensive saw, cloth, and flour mills are erected. The Street railway, which runs from here through Ottawa to Suspension Bridge, has its stables, depot and offices in this village. For electoral purposes it is in the county of Russell, for all others, in Carleton. Montreal Telegraph Company has an office here. Distant from Ottawa 1 mile. Mail daily. Population about 800.
