THE Presbyterian General Assembly which met recently at Detroit has issued a pronunciamento utterly condemning all games of "progressive euchre," an amusement which is, indeed, worthy of condemnation when it is made a game of gambling ; but it is sometimes, at all events, played at private parties, without stakes, merely for amusement, in which case the evil effects attributed to it by the Assembly do not follow. 
