Whereas, by Our Froclamation bearing date the seventeenth day of September last, we thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Executive Council, to prorogue Our Provincial Parliament until the twenty-sixth day of October next, at which time, in Our Town of York, you were held and constrained to appear; but We, taking into Our Royal consideration the ease and convenience of Our Loving Subjects, have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Executive Council, to relieve you, and each of you, of your attendance at the time aforesaid; hereby convoking, and by these presents enjoining you, and each of you, that on the second day of December next ensuing you meet us in Our Provincial Parliament, in Our Town of York, there to take into consideration the state and welfare of our said Province of Upper Canada, and therein to do as may seem necessary; herein fail not.
