

#### Mercier, Defiant, Predicts Victory

Tells the Belgians They Soon Will be Freed From German Yoke

LONDON, Sept. 3 .- (Correspondence)-July 21 last was the eightyfifth anniversary of the ascension to the throne of the first King of the Belgians and the eighty-sixth of the declaration of Belgian independence. It was made notable in Brussels by the sudden appearance before a great congregation in the Cathedral of Cardinal Mercier, Archbishop Mecklin and primate of Belgium, and his deliverance of an intensely pas

#### Chaplain Honoured By King George

Among the recipients of recen onours for conspicuous bravery the cause of human liberty on the western battle front is Rev. Fathe Ambrose Madden, formerly of Ottawa University, to whom has been award ed a military cross for gallant con duct under fire. It will be remem bered that Rev. Father Madden lef ondon some months ago with Rev Father McCarthy, and those who me im in this city will rejoice with his riends at Lindsay, at Ottawa and in the west, at the news of the recog nition that has fallen to his valor. The official record states that Rev Father Madden manifested conspicu ous bravery under heavy fire, assist ed to dress the wounded, and conduct ed men blinded to the dressing sta tions. He undoubtely saved lives by digging men out of buried trenches. Rev. Father madden's feats o bravery are the more notable from the fact that he was not a robus man, but on the contrary, for some time previous to his going to th northwest, had enjoyed but indifferen health. Indeed, it was the need o recovering his health that sent hin to the Canadian west from his schol astic duties at Ottawa University. Returning from the northwest where for six months he had beer atholic chaplain at a military camp Rev. Father Madden, who was full of enthusiasm for his work in the army obtained a post as chaplain at the front, through the Right Rev. Bishor tutors at Ottawa University and had been entrusted to select all Englishspeaking Catholic chaplains for the
