and a short but very impressive service was conducted in the court chamber by the same gentlemen who had officiated at the house in the morning, while as many as were able to find room on the floor stood with bowed heads around the bier. Concluding the reading, the Rev. Mr. Beattie said, "Behold, there is a prince and a great man dead this day." Mr. Beattie then addressed the assemblage as follows: "I do not stand before you to tell you how generous, useful and capable in business and religious circles our departed friend was, and not to wear to say what generous impulses swayed his character nor what noble man he was; you who have known him, need not be told of this. As days and years go by you will not leave him out of your minds. There are some men who live in such a manner as to plant themselves deep into your hearts and affections. There are some men whose memories, and such a man was this. I stand commissioned by her who was nearest and dearest to him to bring to you this intelligence, that God in His infinite mercy gave him a few moments of clear consciousness before his death in which to make his peace. On Tuesday morning, 40 hours before he died, he regained his senses, and bravely looked death straight in the face. He faced the situation like the noble man he was, and said he was resigned to God and to the Lord's service, but if it was the desire of the All-wise he was quite prepared to go. He had made his peace with his God and felt sure of his future. I am here to give you this comforting message. He looked upon the great work which had engrossed his energies, and was quite prepared to leave it all, if it was God's will. He belonged to a family of long life, and though not of the most robust constitution he had looked forward to a long life. After long and anxious thought he kept repeating over and over again the last words of his lucid moments: 'Forty solid years, thought to live; forty solid years.' My dear friends, shall we not learn a great lesson from this good man's death? Does it not show to us the mercy and the great power of God? We should thank the Lord that He grants those last few moments of consciousness, and that he said: 'This will be done,' and was prepared."

THE WHOLE CITY IN MOURNING
The grandest funeral that has ever taken place in Guelph was witnessed on Saturday afternoon, when a princely number of men was laid away in the silent grave. It was the public funeral of Mayor Goldie, whose body had been taken in the forenoon from his late residence to the council chamber to lie in state.

IMPOSING CEREMONIES
The religious services were of an imposing character, and were noticed in our columns on Saturday, when we issued an addition at 12 o'clock giving the full particulars of the funeral obsequies up to that hour. The family and relatives of the deceased, including even the assistance of ostentation or display, were fain to lay their beloved dead in the grave without the performance of the ceremonies necessarily attending a public funeral, but the earnest solicitations of the City Council and their friends prevailed, and the solemnity of sorrow at the sudden death, and many of the public buildings were draped in mourning, while all the banks and stores on the line of march were closed during the hours for the funeral.
