RECONQUEST OF THE SOUDAN.

KHARTOUM WILL BE CAPTURED AND

MAHDI SMASHED WITHIN A MONTH.

LONDON, Aug. 21.—The Anglo-Egyptian

reconquest of the Sudan is steadily

approaching its culmination. Khartoum

will be captured and Mahdi, smothered

within a month, but Englishmen have

not yet reached the stage of excitement

over what is one of the most remarkable

and unintermittently successful military

enterprises in British history.

Gen. Kitchener is the youngest man of

his rank in the British army. He has

made no mistakes, and now has perfectly

equipped army of 25,000 men of all arms

1,700 miles from his starting point, and

ready to deliver the last crushing blow

on the enemy. There has been no

time, and this fact has led to foreign

suspicion as to the aims of British policy

in the Sudan.

If the French think about the matter

at all they assume that Gen. Kitchener

will clear out of the Sudan as soon as the

Durbar are fully defeated. The

assumption is unfounded. Whatever the

British government may have said a

year or two ago, the intention now is to

keep the Sudan and more. Its policy

embraces the possibility—may

probability of war with Abyssinia,

despite King Menelik's newly-found

friendship in Egypt and St. Petersburg.

The purely British regime will be

gradually withdrawn from the Sudan

but General Kitchener's Egyptian

troops, as a from Egyptian

possessions into real fighting men, and the

Soudanese warriors, who have learned

to worship their British officers, will

remain to extend and complete the scheme

of conquest. General Kitchener's

army, as a result of the Sudan

border of Uganda, there to get the

The accuracy of the information which

the Sudanese obtain respecting the move-

ments of the Khalifa has enabled him

to make his dispositions for the coming

advance on Khartoum with the utmost

precision.

Prior to fall of Berber the Intelligence

Department had frequently much diffi-

culty in judging of the expedition that

was likely to be met in the advance but

since then their work has been much

simplified.

When Berber was captured, a number

of merchants were found there who

had correspondents in Khartoum. They

were left unharmed on the understanding

that they furnished all the information

they obtained to the expedition. They

fully appreciated the danger in which

they were placed and the danger to

their lives and property.

On the other hand, they have doubt-

less told, probably with some embel-

lishment, the preparations which were

made for the advance on Khartoum.

The result has been to bring over many

warmers to our side, and the result is

In conversation with Colonel Wingate,

the British general, who was

captured at the battle of Atbara,

said that at the mosque of Omdurman

the British and Canadian

troops were seen to be fighting men

with 1,300 warriors in each row.

The latest intelligence from Omdur-

man is that the Khalifa's army

intends to resist to the last. His body

guards, his own tribesmen and blacks

will probably fight desperately.

RUSSIA MUST STOP NOW.

ENGLAND WILL STAND NO FURTHER

AGGRESSION IN ASIA.

NEW YORK, Aug. 22.—A Sun cable

says: London, Aug. 22.—The past week

has been a week of great but secret

activity in the European political world.

There has been no clear and decisive

development in the complex crisis, which

includes the future of China and the

Philippines as well as the relations

between Great Britain and the

United States. The situation is

confusing and the future is uncertain.

Nevertheless, information comes

from a source which I am bound to

accept without question to the effect

that the limit of British concession and

retreat has at last been reached, and that

any further aggression by Russia in Asia

will bring war along the line. I am fully

aware that this announcement will be

received with incredulity, even by

many.
