## HE IS NOW SORRY.

"Unwritten Law" to Save Captain Pringle.

Wife Ready to Testify in Murder of Geo. McKinnon.

Port Huron, April 19.—Nervous at first but composed as he entered the crowded police court room, Capt. Ralph Pringle was arraigned to-day on a charge of murdering George Birell McKinnon, of Moretown, Ont., in a saloon known as "The Hole in the Wall," at St. Clair shortly after midnight Sunday.

His attorneys waived the reading of the complaint, and his examination was sent for Friday morning, a plea of not guilty being entered by the court and bail being denied. The prisoner was not notified of his victim's death until the time of his arraignment, and when the news was broken, he said: "Is that so? Well, I'm sorry."

The story is told to-day that when Capt. Pringle accused young McKinnon of being intimate with his wife, the young man sat back in his chair, and tantalized the vessel man, saying it was none of his business if he and Mrs. Pringle had been friendly.

McKinnon formerly had charge of the night ferry running between St. Clair and Courtright. There is a story told that once, between two and three years ago, McKinnon rowed Mrs. Pringle across the St. Clair River, and ever since that time Pringle has harbored a deadly hatred for McKinnon.

Mrs. Pringle will take the stand to free her husband. Her attorneys say she will give testimony similar to a confession made to her husband regarding herself and McKinnon.

The defense will be the unwritten law, according to the lawyers.
