CONDITIONS RE LORD BEAVERBROOK SCHOLARSHIPS

The conditions relating to the applications for and awards of the Lord Beaverbrook Scholarships are set out in a communication by Mr. A. S. Robinson.

According to the letter applications for the scholarships may be made after the matriculants have completed writing their exams.

There are five annual scholarships founded by Lord Beaverbrook open for award to candidates who pass the University of New Brunswick Matriculation Examinations. Each scholarship has an annual value of \$325 for four years.

The scholarships are open in Arts, Science, Applied Science, Theology, Law, Medicine, Engineering and Forestry.

The scholarships except in the case of Theology are in undenominational colleges.

While the U. N. B. matriculation is adopted as a standard for the educational merits of the candidate the committee in making the award, in addition will take into consideration the moral character, individual habits and financial standing of the candidate so that those selected, viewed from all standpoints, may be the most deserving.

By the terms of the Trust three of the five scholarships must be awarded to students outside of the St. John and Fredericton districts.

Candidates must address applications to Mr. S. Dow Simmons, Secretary of the Lord Beaverbrook Trust, Fredericton, N. B.

Mr. Henry Ward of this place spent Saturday evening with Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Harris of Doaktown.


