STELLA MARIS REPORT. - The HAS 22,000 OLD AND YOUNG SEALS The s.s. Bellaventure, Capt, Job ing from the icefields, hailing for between 22,000 and 23,000 old and young seals. The ship in company with the Beothic was the first in the fat, and striking the N.E. corner of the northern patch on the 15th March about 70 miles to the N.E. of the Groais Islands. The men killed and panned Goods store, unable to get work in 8,000 on the 16th, and followed up that work until the patch was cleaned up the old seals. Since then she has been following the old fat and went down about 70 miles north of Belle Isle, and was off the Seal Islands on Labrador. She bore up from there and left the ice at the Funks at 2.30 p.m. yesterday. The captain reports old seals so plentiful that all the ships of the fleet could load with them arrived she was visited by Drs. Campbell and Brehm and was allowed to haul in immediately, as none of the crew showed signs of sickness of any kind. The ship reports the Eagle on Thursday last with 2,300 seals. 
