Persons belonging to the Dominion of Canada who enter this Colony with Canadian Permits must present the same to the Deputy Minister of Customs, St. John's, to be vised, or, in the event of their not visiting St. John's, to the nearest Collector of Customs.

Persons from Canada, the United States or other countries, before leaving Newfoundland, must obtain from the Deputy Minister of Customs, St. John's, a Permit to embark either at St. John's or Port aux Basques. In the event of their not visiting St. John's, they must apply to the nearest Collector of Customs, who will wire their application to the Deputy Minister of Customs, St. John's.
