Miss Hughes Receives Warm Welcome

FROM PUPILS OF ST. BON'S.

This morning at 11.30, Miss Katherine Hughes received a hearty ovation from the boys of St. Bonaventure's College, who were assembled in the Aula Maxima to meet her. The platform was tastefully decorated with trophies and plants, and as Miss Hughes came on the stage she was heartily applauded by the boys. The Principal, in introducing her, mentioned that she had devoted the greater part of her life to the service of Ireland. In speaking with the famous and inimitable Mr. G. K. Chesterton in June, 1914, she asked him if he thought that the old Gaelic civilization was returning to its original state. "It is," he said, "coming back; coming back for the betterment of the present civilization of Western Europe." The old Brehon Laws, which were abolished in the reign of Edward III, stand for a purer democracy than any in the world, and if the English Government did not let this democracy run its own course, they would forfeit the respect of the world. There are twenty million Irish, outside of Ireland, who are united in act and deed to aid their homeland. The Governments of the British Dominions are co-partners with the English Government, and if those dominions make no protest, they are co-partners in the English Government's attitude towards Ireland. It is up to us to make a protest and to save the honor of the Empire. The action in regard to Ireland is not by the English people, but by the Government and other English people scattered throughout the world and in sympathy with their friends in Ireland. Neither was any religious conflict raised in Ireland by Irishmen. It was the work of unprincipled men looking for power. To illustrate the spirit of the Irish people, Miss Hughes told the incident of the little Irish Boy Scout of Wexford—Willie Connors. He was taken by the police to jail, where in a dark cell, surrounded night and day by armed men, he was kept for six weeks. Why? Because despite the promises of reward held out to him he would not perjure his soul by swearing falsely regarding the shooting of a policeman. At the end of six weeks he was released. Miss Hughes closed her lecture with the Gaelic blessing of "God be with my Comrades."

The Principal proposed a vote of thanks to the lecturer which was unanimously seconded by a burst of cheering from Miss Hughes. Immediately after her lecture, Miss Hughes motored to the station where she left by the express for Cape Breton, where she is engaged to deliver a series of lectures on the subject of Ireland.
