TORONTO, Ont., Feb. 12—11 p.m.—Deep

depression exists tonight in the Lower

St. Lawrence Valley and in the Northwest

last night. Snow is now falling in Mani-

toba and the Northwest Territories.

has two pipes, one covering the valve rod (dry

pipe) and the other conveying the water to the

spout (wet pipe). The rod in this hydrant is

actuated by a brass screw and handle above

the rising plunger, the smallest fraction of

an inch, closes waste before any water can

escape. The valve is operated by a

water through the hydrant which can well be

compared to a straightway valve or round-

way cock. Closing the valve empties all water

from wet pipe through dry hole. To repair

by crank or washer remove top cap or plate

and withdraw plug valve. It can be

readily repaired without digging up.
