Three Killed in Collision of New Jersey Trolleys.

Paterson, N. J., July 22.—Two highspeed trolley cars, travelling in opposite directions on a single track, met yesterday afternoon on the edge of a curve near Ridgewood, seven miles from here, and in the resultant crash three persons lost their lives and twenty-four others sustained serious infuries. The dead: Francis J. Pilgrim, 40 years old, of

Francis J. Pilgrim. 40 years old, of Ridgewood, superintendent of the North Jersey Rapid Transit Company; William Hutchinson, motorman of one of the cars, and John Frotalli, a passenger, who died in the hospital late last night from his injuries.

The collision occurred on the line of the North Jersey Rapid Transit Company, which runs from this city to Suffern, N. Y. Motormen of both cars, believing they had a clear track, ran at top speed to make the next slding quickly and allow the other car to pass.
