

RETURNED CANOE INDICATES TRAGEDY

Wm. Fraser, of Owen Sound, Probably Drowned in Bay.

GIPSIES HEARD SHOUTS BUT, OWING TO FOG, COULD NOT HELP.

The canoe was found this morning near the Doric Cement Company's dock, about half full of water and a cushion belonging to Mr. Fraser was seen floating near the same spot. The missing man went out alone in the canoe last evening and that was the last seen of him. When he did not come home last evening his wife became alarmed, and early this morning search parties were organized and they have scoured the shores of the bay all day, but so far they have been unsuccessful in their search for the body. Mr. Fraser was accustomed to going out alone in the evenings, and he sometimes used to go camping on the lake shore heard someone shouting on the bay during the night, but the fog was so dense they could not see anything.
