### MANY STRIKERS ARE ARRESTED IN OUEBEC CITY

Walkouts Are Illegal, According To Act Recently Passed.

QUEBEC, June 27 .- By Canadian Press.-In spite of appeals made by His Eminence Cardinal Begin for conciliation, the strike of the Quebec police and firemen continued at midnight tonight with but little prospect of settlement.

The city apparently is determined to fight the men and had warrants sworn out before Magistrate Choquette tonight for the arrest of some twenty strikers. Five firemen, including the president of the union, Wilfrid Garieppy, were arrested at their homes to night by the city detectives, but the other men had gone to their meeting place at St. Peter's Market Hall be-fore the detectives could reach them. Strike is illegal.
