

AFTERNOON SESSION.

THE HORSE PURCHASED BY NORTHERN BERKSHIRE SOCIETY.

Mr. Swin, who had been the Secretary of the Society, stated that the horse purchased by the Northern Berkshire Society, \$300, was still due. The St. John horse and Sunbury horse were only paid for, and he saw no reason why the Northern Berkshire Society should be relieved except their own necessity.

Mr. Swin thought that the Board would be doing nothing wrong in relieving the Society from the debt. The funds of the Society were exhausted in the payment of the horse. The delegates who purchased the animal had given \$300 or \$400 more than they had been instructed, and the Government, got the money. The Society had been able to hold no local shows, and they have nothing to show for their funds. People are apt to think that they are not expending the money properly, and there is danger of the Society going down unless relieved. The horse has been doing good service the past year, but during previous years was not the source of any income. If the Society is relieved from this debt for a time it will probably come up again and the Society might eventually pay for it. He asked for the indulgence that could be granted, if this year's year is kept from the Society as feared that the effect would be injurious. He moved that a year's time be allowed the Northern Berkshire Agricultural Society in which to pay the debt on the horse, Victor Hugo. The motion was seconded by Mr. Fairweather and carried.

REPORT OF STOCK.

Mr. Fairweather from the committee to whom was referred the subject of the importation of stock reported, recommending that the list of stock drawn up this morning be adopted. The report was adopted.

FRIDAY MORNING'S SESSION.

The Board met pursuant to adjournment at 10 o'clock. The President in the chair and a full attendance of members. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Whenever such accounts shall have been audited and approved, the same shall be certified by the Secretary of the Board, and transmitted to the Lieutenant Governor in Council, with the request of the Board that a warrant issue in the usual form on the Treasury General in favor of the Treasurer of the Society for the amount to which such society is entitled.

REPORT OF THE CATTLE.

The committee appointed to take into consideration the exportation of cattle in connection with a subsidized line of steamers, submitted the following report:

The committee appointed to consider the subject of the exportation of cattle and sheep from New Brunswick in connection with the establishment of a line of steamers from St. John to a port in Great Britain, beg to report:

The committee is deeply impressed with the very great importance of the subject under consideration. The committee has carefully considered the valuable documents kindly transmitted to it by the Agricultural Committee of the St. John Board of Trade, and with committee has no doubt, the establishment of a steamship line would encourage our farmers all over New Brunswick, to go extensively into cattle raising for export, either live or slaughtered, to the English market, while it would, in many other ways, direct and indirect, tend greatly to promote the agricultural and other important interests of the Province.

The committee, therefore, beg leave to submit the following resolutions:

Resolved, That the Board of Agriculture of New Brunswick cordially favor the desirability and importance of encouraging, in every way within its power, the development of the export trade in cattle and sheep, and that it be the duty of the Board to use its influence with the Federal Government and in Parliament to secure the most favorable consideration of the Farmers and breeders and stock raisers of the Province;

Resolved, That it is the opinion of this Board that it is indispensable to the permanent establishment and success of the trade that a line of steamers between St. John and Liverpool, G. B., be provided with well equipped, fast, and reliable service, and with as little delay as the circumstances and necessities of the case may warrant; and that it is further the opinion of this Board that the Federal Government ought to submit to the Dominion Parliament, during its present session, provision for the granting of a subsidy of at least \$50,000 per annum for a term of not less than three years in aid and subsidy of such service;

Resolved, That the humble memorial of the Board of Agriculture be prepared and signed by President and Secretary, and transmitted to His Excellency the Governor General in Council, praying that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to take this memorial into favorable consideration, and submit to Parliament during its present session, provision for the payment of a subsidy in aid of said service, of the sum and for the term mentioned; or that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to make such other provision in the premises as may seem just and intended to secure the purposes contemplated by these resolutions.
