MERLIN DAVIES AT CAMPBELLTON

The music lovers of the town had an interesting treat provided when last Wednesday evening when Merlin Davies and his company gave a musical recital. Mr. Davies is reckoned the greatest oratorio tenor in Canada and in choice of songs showed that he was equally at home in ballad music. A feature of the programme was the duet by Mr. and Mrs. Davies which was enthusiastically encored. Mrs. Davies' best number was "In the time of Roses" which suited her clear soprano voice splendidly, while all her songs were sung with admirable taste. Mr. R. Dumbrell sang "There's a land" with great power

and sung his little Irish songs with cute quaintness. Mr. E. B.
