The Dominion Government paid out during
the year ended June 30, 1903, on account of
railway subsidies, \$1,463,222.

The St. Thomas Brass Co. recently passed
a by-law increasing its capital stock from
\$25,000 to \$100,000, and this has been con-
firmed by the granting of supplementary let-
ters patent under the Ontario Companies' Act.

The Press Association of the Province of
Quebec will visit the St. Louis Exposition in

Illinois Central Rd., and from Toronto will be
on the special train carrying the Canadian
Press Association, particulars of which were

The Canadian Inspection Co. (Ltd.), recent-
ly incorporated under the Dominion Com-
panies' Act, to inspect and report on railway
works, bridges, docks, etc., and materials en-
tering into the construction of the same, has
been registered under the Ontario act re-
specting extra provincial companies. A. A.
Wighton, Toronto, is the Company's attorney
in Ontario.
