CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

Favorable conditions characterize the white pine lumber trade of Ontario. Buying is being conducted with a little more conservatism than earlier in the season, but it is evident by the volume of forders that the stocks of retail dealers are in need of replenishment. The best grades continue to lead in point of strength, and some manufacturers are pursuing a marking-up process in respect to the prices of such of these grades as are unsold. The poorer qualities of pine are a shade weaker. In the Ottawa valley attention is now turning to the prospective purchases of next season's production of deals. The opinion is freely expressed that no reduction from the prices of the past season will be accepted by manufacturers. It is pointed out that very light stocks are being carried in mill yards. A Georgian Bay manufacturer one week ago announced that over 80 per cent. of his season's production had been contracted. for. The supply of lath does not seem to increase. It is very scarce on the Georgian Bay, and as a result several car-loads were brought to Torcato last week from Ottawa. No. 2 is particularly strong and brings within 25 cents as much as No. 1. The demand for hemlock has failen cff slightly. The current quotation f. o. b. cars Toronto is \$12, with a higher price for long lengths. Hardwoods are beginning to evince signs of improvement, although a noticeable feature of the trade this fall is the call for small lots, apparently showing that buyers are not afraid of higher prices. In maple and birch stocks are comparatively heavy.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

The statement of lumber exports from the port of Montreal shows that a policy of contraction is being pursued by shippers. The exports between now and the close of navigation are likely to be light, although the low freight rates offer exceptional opportunities for getting the

lumber across the Atlantic at low cost. The timber market at Quebec is unchanged. The quantity of white and red pine timber measured by the Supervisor of Cullers is about the same as last year. Birch and maple show a decrease, while elm and ash are about one-third greater. Manufacturers are taking a much more hopeful view regarding the outlook for spruce deals. As the season graws to a close, it is found that the quantity to be carried over until next spring is smaller than was anticipated. In Nova Scotia, for instance, there will be practically no spruce deals carned over, as the South American and West Indian markets have provided an outlet for a large percentage of the production. Cuban cargoes are selling at \$12.50, and South American cargoes at \$12 to \$12.50. French specifications represent the only class of lumber that has not begun to improve.

MANITOBA AND BRITISH COLUMBIA.

The anticipations of dealers in respect to the volume of fall trade have so far not been realized. The demand is more backtrard than was expected, due partly to the continuation of the carpeniers' strike. Shiplap and granary boards are moving freely, but dimension and common boards, of which manufacturers hold a comparatively heavy stock, are slow of sale. The last revision of the price list of British Columbia lumber, for delivery in Manitoba, made a reduction of \$2 on No. 1 edge grain flooring and 2 x 4 and 2 x 6 dimension up to 32 ft. long, a reduction of \$1 on 2 x 14 up to 14 x 14 dimension, and of \$1.50 on 2 x 8, 2 x 10, 3 x 4 and 3 x 6 up to 32 ft. long. The range of dimensions is now from \$18 to \$22. No. 1 clear siding was advanced \$2.50 to \$32.50, and No. 3 ceiling 50c. to \$23.50. While trade is a little quiet at present, manufacturers and dealers regard. the outlook as bright. The British Columbia mills are fairly busy. Foreign shipments have been quite heavy, as up to the end of August of this year fortyeight vessels have sailed with lumber cargoes for foreign destinations. More lumber has been shipped to Great Britain than last year. It is rumored that a syndicate, headed by Mr. J. J. Hill, is negotiating for the purchase of all the saw mills in British Columbia. The report however, is not generally believed.

UNITED STATES.

The week under review covers one day when Eusiness was entirely suspended out of respect to the obsequies of the late
