KLEINE WELT (Little World) for plano By Gustav Lange, Whaley, Royce & Co., Toronto, 75 cents

Too much cannot be said in praise of this admirable little collection of pieces for young players. It contains nine charming compositions, which are sure to interest and educate youthful students. Though exceedingly simple, they are written in such a musicianly manner and have such a pretty effect, that they create a desire for further study of good music. The method is clear, simple and comprehensive, gives the beginner full instructions and leads him through a series of-progressive studies until he is able to play a number of pretty amusements and standard solos.

YOU AND CANOE Song by M. de S. Wedd Whaley Royce & Co., Toronto. 40 cents.


