

PROVISIONS REGARDING THE CONVEYANCE OF LETTER MAILS BY AIR

I

The Administrations of British India and of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics have the option of collecting for each section of their inland air service, the transport charges provided by Article 14

II

Right of reducing the unit of weight for Air Mail correspondence. Where the system of weights permits Administrations have the right to adopt a unit of weight less than that of 20 grammes prescribed by Article 5, § 2. In this case, the fee is fixed according to the unit of weight adopted.

III

Exceptional charges in favour of certain European Countries. European Administrations which, owing to the geographic situation of their territory, experience difficulty in adopting a uniform charge for the whole of Europe are authorized to effect charges proportionate to the distance in accordance with the provisions of Article 5, § 2. This right is also accorded to the other European countries for their traffic with the countries referred to in the preceding paragraph.
