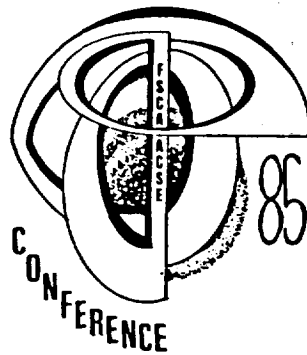
In November the first phase of the Community Liaison Coordinator programme was implemented. Hopefully, everyone is aware of its existence, especially at posts. If you are not, ask your admin officer or head of post about taking part in the program. As a spouse at post you are eligible to apply for the contract. As a spouse in Ottawa you are eligible for the training program; in fact, if you plan to apply for the contract it would be advisable to take the course. The FSCA was closely involved in its development.

The Re-Entry Committee has been renamed the Mobility Committee as that was felt to more accurately represent its area of activity. Its members are Terri Lobsinger, Carolyn Sunquist, Pilar Todd and Laurel Pardy (coordinator). Various avenues for the use of spouses as resource persons for Pre-Posting Briefings are being established with the Posting Services Centre. An Advance Re-Entry kit to be sent to the post, and an Arrival Re-Entry Kit to be picked up in Ottawa, are being compiled.

A neighbourhood contact network has been set up for personnel returning to Ottawa (call 993-5729 M-F 9-12:30.) to help alleviate that bereft feeling that accompanies relocation. If you have not been contacted about being a member of the network and are willing to be a resource person for either someone going out to a post where you have served, or, a family returning to live in your neighbourhood, please call the Mobility Committee at the office and volunteer your services.

A major paper exploring various aspects of the posting cycle — uprooting, cross cultural adaptation, the process of re-entry — and its effect on various age groups has been prepared. At this moment it is awaiting translation and printing.
