
EXPORT TRADE DEVELOPMENT

Highlights

- Canadian exposure to Asian and Pacific Rim countries contributed to a growth in Canadian export of advanced technology, which outpaced growth averages in the industry as a whole.
- Excluding trade among European
 Community countries, Canada is the
 world's fastest growing exporter of
 processed food.
- Sales resulting directly from the Program for Export Market Development activities will exceed \$1 billion for the third consecutive year.

The activities of the International Trade Development Branch during the past year reflect one of the Department's primary objectives, which is to support the Canadian business community's efforts to develop export markets. An equally important objective is to acquire foreign investment and technology within the context of rapid globalization of business, and an increasingly competitive trading environment.
