

which was received too late for inclusion in last year's review. Canada was represented at this Conference by Dr. W. A. Riddell.

Canada participated in the Sixth Session of the General Conference of the International Refrigeration Institute held at Rome on the 11th April, being represented by the Hon. Philippe Roy.

At the International Labour Conference held at Geneva from the 30th May to the 16th June the Government was represented by the Hon. Peter Heenan, Minister of Labour, and Dr. W. A. Riddell, Messrs. T. J. Coughlin, and O. Filion, attending as their technical advisers. The delegate representing the employers was Mr. H. H. Camp, Vice-President of the Steel Company of Canada, who was assisted by Mr. E. Blake Robertson as technical adviser. The workers' delegate was Mr. Tom Moore, President of the Trades and Labour Congress, with whom as technical adviser was Mr. Robert J. Tallon. The Conference adopted a Draft Convention concerning the creation of minimum wage fixing machinery and a recommendation concerning the application of such machinery.

The Eighth World's Dairy Conference was held in Great Britain in the months of June and July, Canada's representative being Dr. J. J. Ruddick, Dairy and Cold Storage Commissioner of the Department of Agriculture.

At the invitation of the United States Government Canadian representatives attended the Fourth International Congress of Entomology held at Ithaca, New York, in August.

An invitation was also received through the Italian Government from the President of the Organizing Committee of the International Union Against Tuberculosis to the Sixth Conference of that Union held in Rome in September, and Dr. R. E. Wodehouse, Secretary of the Canadian Tuberculosis Association, was appointed to represent Canada at this Conference.

The Ninth General Assembly of the League of Nations opened at Geneva on the 3rd September, and was brought to a close on the 26th of that month, Canada's representatives being the Prime Minister, the Right Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King, the Hon. Raoul Dandurand and the Hon. Charles Dunning. Among the resolutions adopted at this session were those relating to the following subjects:—

- 1. Codification of International Law;
- 2. Revision of Statute of Permanent Court of International Justice;
- 3. Reports of various organizations of the League;
- 4. Alcoholism;
- 5. Pacific settlement of international disputes;
- 6. Preparatory Commission for Disarmament Conference;
- 7. Creation of League radiotelegraphic station;
- 8. Traffic in opium and other dangerous drugs.

A separate report from the delegates giving a full account of the proceedings will be laid before Parliament.

An Empire Forestry Conference was held in September and October in Australia and New Zealand, to which delegates were sent by the Canadian Government in the persons of Mr. E. H. Finlayson, Director of Forestry, Department of the Interior, Mr. D. Roy Cameron, Assistant Director, and Dr. J. M. Swaine, Associate Dominion Entomologist.

The Conference of the International Telegraph Union was held at Brussels in September to consider the question of revising the methods of computing code and cypher telegrams, which was attended by Mr. C. P. Edwards of the Department of Marine and Fisheries and Mr. J. R. M. Walker of this Department as Canadian delegates.

An invitation was received from the United States Government to an International Conference on Civil Aeronautics held under its auspices at Washington December 12 to 14, to which Mr. G. J. Desbarats, Deputy Minister of
