Selecting Blocks

A selection of multiple cells is referred to as a *block*. You might want to select a block when entering a group of data or when you want to perform the same action on several cells. You can select data with either the *pointer* or the keyboard. The active cell in a block is delineated by a bold border and white background.

_ METHOD -

To select a block of cells:

Mouse method

1. Drag the pointer through the block of cells.

Keyboard method

- 1. Select the first cell of the block.
- 2. Press SHIFT and the arrow keys to highlight the block. or
- 2. Press and hold SHIFT, and then click the last cell in the block.
- 3. Release SHIFT when done.

EXERCISE-

In the following exercise, you will select a block of cells using both the keyboard and mouse methods.

| 1. | Drag the pointer from cell A1 to cell D5 | The block A1 through D5 is selected. |

| 8. | Press RIGHT ARROW three times | The block A1 through D1 is selected. |
