

Selecting Blocks

A selection of multiple cells is referred to as a *block*. You might want to select a block when entering a group of data or when you want to perform the same action on several cells. You can select data with either the *pointer* or the keyboard. The active cell in a block is delineated by a bold border and white background.

METHOD

To select a block of cells:

Mouse method

1. Drag the pointer through the block of cells.

Keyboard method

1. Select the first cell of the block.
2. Press **SHIFT** and the arrow keys to highlight the block.
or
2. Press and hold **SHIFT**, and then click the last cell in the block.
3. Release **SHIFT** when done.

EXERCISE

In the following exercise, you will select a block of cells using both the keyboard and mouse methods.

| 1. Drag the pointer from cell A1 to cell D5 | <i>The block A1 through D5 is selected.</i> |
| 2. Select cell B2 | <i>The block is deselected and cell B2 is selected.</i> |
| 3. Press and hold SHIFT | |
| 4. Click cell E7 | <i>The block B2 through E7 is selected.</i> |
| 5. Release SHIFT | |
| 6. Select cell A1 | <i>The block is deselected.</i> |
| 7. Press and hold SHIFT | |
| 8. Press RIGHT ARROW three times | <i>The block A1 through D1 is selected.</i> |
