The Department of External Affairs announced today the appointment of Dr. E.H. Coleman, who has been Canadian Ambassador to Cuba, as Canadian Ambassador to Brazil to succeed Mr. J.S. Macdonald who has been appointed Canadian Ambassador to Yugoslavia.

It is expected that Dr. Coleman will take up his new appointment some time during November.

Dr. Coleman was born on July 21, 1890. He was educated at Carleton Place High School and the University of Manitoba. He was called to the Bar of Manitoba in 1922 and was subsequently created King's Counsel (Dominion) in 1929. He was Dean of the Manitoba Law School from 1929-33. He was appointed Under-Secretary of State and Deputy-Registrar General of Canada in 1933 which position he held on his appointment as Canadian Minister to Cuba in January 1949. In 1937 the University of Manitoba conferred upon him the degree of LL.D.
