date of union or from the date of unemployment, whichever is the later, on the same scale and under the same conditions as unemployment insurance benefits under the said act and regulations made thereunder, and on rates based on the individual's wage record for the three months preceding his loss of employment; but no person shall receive such assistance and unemployment insurance benefits concurrently; and such assistance shall be deemed to be a benefit or payment within the meaning of section sixty-seven of the said act; the governor in council is authorized to make such regulations as he may deem necessary to administer this vote and give effect to the purposes and terms thereof, \$2,000,000.

A—Department

795. International labour conferences — further amount required, \$15,000.

Annuities Act—

796. To authorize repayment during the current or any future fiscal year out of unappropriated moneys in the consolidated revenue fund of moneys heretofore or hereafter paid to the receiver general of Canada on account of the purchase of annuities under the Government Annuities Act which are not so applied, \$1.

B—Unemployment Insurance Act, 1940—

797. Administration, including expenditures incurred in connection with the activities of the national employment service as delegated by the Minister of Labour in accordance with section 88 of the act—further amount required, \$500,000.

798. To authorize and provide for payment of unemployment assistance to residents of Newfoundland who have been employed in employment that would have been insurable employment within the meaning of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1940, if it had been employment in Canada, or who have been employed in insurable employment within the meaning of the said act, for at least thirty per cent of the working days within the period of three months preceding their loss of employment or thirty per cent of the working days within the period since the date of union, whichever period is the longer, and who lose their employment within six months prior to the date of union and are still unemployed at that date, or who lose their employment within a two-year period after that date, such assistance to be payable during a period of six months from the date of union or from the date of unemployment, whichever is the later, on the same scale and under the same conditions as unemployment insurance benefits under the said act and regulations made thereunder, and on rates based on the individual's wage record for the three months preceding his loss of employment; but no person shall receive such assistance and unemployment insurance benefits concurrently; and such assistance shall be deemed to be a benefit or payment within the meaning of section sixty-seven of the said act; the governor in council is authorized to make such regulations as he may deem necessary to administer this vote and give effect to the purposes and terms thereof—further amount required, \$1,000,000.
