Defence Lawyers Enter Appeal Against Conviction of William Derry.

ONE YEAR AND LASHES

Counsel Claims That Sentence Was Imposed "In Spirit of Petulance."

On a series of grounds ranging from prejudice, vindictiveness, the actual misleading of the jurors and a sentence so extreme as to exceed all idea of fustice, an appeal will be laid against Judge Morgan's conviction of William Derry on Wednesday, June 6, for indecent assault. One year and ten lashes was imposed on the young man following his conviction of illusing a young girl whom he and a colleagne had taken juy-riding in an auto. The girl herself, Maud Horton,

auto. The girl herself, Maud Horton, appeared in the witness box at the trial, and among other things it is charged by Holmes and Holmes, solicitors for the accused, that the judge exhorted the jury to consider her evidence against that of four others.

That the prisoner was not given the benefit of a doubt, that the verdict was contrary to the evidence and that the sentence itself was passed in a spirit of petulance, resentment and prejudice, constitute some of the bases for the appeal. It is also maintained that Judge Morgan exceeded his powers in including a perjury charge and that the calling of the complainant to the box after the jury verdict was in, but before sentence was passed was entirely contrary to legal practice.

By special leave of the court the motion will appear in the appellate court and a new trial will be asked.
