

The sole head of a family, or any mai over eighteen years old, may homestea a quarter-section of available Dominio land in Man toba, Saskatchewan or Ai

land in Man. toba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency,) on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A nomesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least sighty acres, on certain conditions. A labitable house is required except what residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good starding may pre-empt a quarter-section allegated his homestead. Price, 33.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months' residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also fifty acres extra cultivation.
