more fincerely lamented, no where are the bonours paid, fo juffly proportioned to the merit of the dead; and no where can the force of his example produce more happy effects than in the Capital of England. The name of Cook shall be as lafting as the remembrance of his diffeoveries, and though he was fubject to the general lot of mortality, he may fet oblivion at defiance, for as he loved his Country, and lived not for himfelf, in reward, his memory shall never die. As long as Mankind shall remain convinced of the Non-exiftence of a Southern continent, as long as the bold Sailor shall plough the vaft Pacifick, as long as remote parts of the globe shall continue to be known, as long as the immenfe weftern coaft of America shall be remembered, and the impractability of a northern paffage to the South Seas shall be acknowledged; jo long shall the great, the humane, the magnanimous James Cook live in the hearts of men, and in the bolom of his Country.

And thou his defolate widow! and ye his melancholy children! refrain your grief, fince thus he will exift for ever upon earth. Confole yourfelves with the thought, ye enlightened nations! ye wife men of the World! Methinks I hear his awful shade addreps his much-loved Country-men in thefe words. My example has been worthy of imitation, and I feel that England will not neglect it, but in future, fill produce the virtuous, and the brave, and in them my fame shall be immortal.

How general is the forrow for the lofs of this Prodigy of Nature, Posterity aljo shall adopt the fentiments of the prefent day,
