North Bay, Jan. 23.—Several infractions of the Ontario Temperance Act were tried before Magistrate Weegar today. The case of Dr. J. J. Bedard, showed that from the first of July to the 22nd he had granted 390 prescriptions.

The doctor claimed that he had a perfect cure for influenza in liquor, milk and ginger the size of a bean, and that from October 1 to January 22 he had given this treatment to 647 patients suffering from flu and had never lost a case. The doctor was fined \$200, and costs amounting to \$50.
