EIGHT HOURS MAKE A DAY
ORGANIZED LABOR HAS MADE A BIG STRIKE

In Extracting From the Ottawa Government a Pledge to Establish the Eight Hour Rule in the Printing Bureau and in the Government Workshops—Sir Charles Backs Up the Movement.

Ottawa, April 3.—(Special).—Organized labor in Canada gained a great victory to-day by securing the recognition of the Government to the principle of an eight-hour day and the definite promise that it would be adopted in the Government workshops and in the printing bureau and without any restriction of pay. As the system will without doubt, when once established, always remain in existence, it will not be many years before a general eight-hour law is placed on the statute book.
