FINANCE AND COMMERCE.

Wheat Futures Were Irregular on
Chicago Board.

But Closed With Net Gain for the
Day on Saturday - Liverpool
Wheat Easier - Big Bank
Clearings of 1898 - General Grain
and Financial Gossip and Notes.

Saturday Evening, Dec. 31.
Liverpool wheat futures were easier to-
day, closing 1/4 to 1/2 cent lower than
yesterday.
Paris wheat closed unchanged to 10 cen-
tes higher than yesterday, with flour
4 to 10 centimes for the day. Antwerp
wheat rose 1/2 centimes.
Liverpool wheat was irregular and active,
but the general tone of that market was
strong. Futures closed 1/4 to 1/2 cent
higher than yesterday.
Liverpool wheat was irregular to-day, and
Chicago, corn easier.
Peas advanced 1/4 at Liverpool to-day.
Lard advanced 3d at Liverpool.
Total clearances to-day: Wheat and
flour equal to 727,000 bushels; corn, 531,000
bushels.
English farmers' deliveries the past
week, 46,300 quarters, at an average price
of 28 1/2 d.
Wheat receipts at Minneapolis and Du-
luth to-day, 508 cars.
Minneapolis stocks of wheat increased
53,653 bushels the past week.
The Chicago Bulletin says that on Friday
last there were enquiries in New York for
wheat for Northern France. Russia Post
was on that day 1/4 lower. Berlin unchanged.
Amsterdam 1/2 higher. Antwerp un-
changed. Paris wheat 1/2 higher. London
closed on same day 1/4 higher than at the
end of preceding week. The shipment to
primary markets and from there to Eastern
markets was considerably hampered by
short supply of cars.
Ocean rates of freight were easy, very
little business being engaged for next
month. Through rates from Chicago to Liv-
erpool nominal at 10s per bushel.
Marine losses on the lakes during 1898
have been considerably larger than during
any previous season. Statements generally
estimate the aggregate loss at about
\$2,600,000.
The Corn Trade News shows that on Dec.
13, 1898, there was a fall in European
United States Pacific ports 18,770,000 bush-
els wheat and flour, of which 9,170,000 bush-
els were for the Continent and 9,600,000
bushels for the United Kingdom. On same
date in 1898 the quantity shipped was only
7,000,000 bushels, all of which is for the
United Kingdom.
Broomhall closed on Tuesday: Argentine
harvest progressing favorably. Liverpool
stocks increased 30,000 bushels last week.
The Continent was buying some of the car-
goes off coast.
The Corn Trade News reports the world's
shipments of wheat and flour last week,
8,870,000 bushels. The Chicago estimate
was 7,050,000 bushels.
Conflicting Market Reports - The Chicago
Bulletin of Wednesday said that prices
opened stronger on better advice from the
eastward, where there was new export busi-
ness and heavy clearings. In another para-
graph it says that the Chicago Bulletin
showed no excitement over the ad-
vance on this side. This morning
the out of line. The same paper says that
the Rosario cable stated that harvesting in Argen-
tine was progressing rapidly, and that car-
goes for shipment were more freely offered.

Big Western Receipts.
The receipts of flour and wheat at the
Western ports of the United States last week
were 286,179 barrels flour and 6,052,216
bushels wheat, compared with 124,807 bar-
rels flour and 3,851,275 bushels wheat the
corresponding week of last year. The re-
ceipts at these markets during the 21 weeks
July 30 to Dec. 27, 1898, were 1,100,000
barrels flour and 3,600,000 bushels wheat in
same period in 1897, about 6,500,000 bushels
of the increase being in flour.
Russian Holding Her Wheat
New York wires: Exporters are loading
here one steamer with wheat for the Baltic
for Spain, and at Galveston one for
Trieste. All these ports are in proximity
to Russian southern ports.
It is evident that Russian exporters are
only shipping such considerable parcels as
have been sold under former contracts.

Triennial Comparison.
The News publishes a triennial compari-
son of the world's wheat crops. It makes
the average for the three years, 1896 to 1898,
inclusive, 307,000,000 quarters; for the three
years, 1893 to 1895, 314,000,000 quarters; and
for the three years, 1890 to 1892, 296,000,000
quarters. The year's crop it estimates at
341,000,000 quarters, as compared with the

largest previous crop, in 1891, 324,000,000.
There are in Europe and America from
eleven to twelve months to feed the world
than in 1894. The visible supply of wheat
on Dec. 1, 1898, is nearly 81,000,000 bushels
less than on Dec. 1, 1894. The News sug-
gests that these two last considerations
may account for the fact that prices now
do not fall so readily as in 1891.
