ARSENIC WORKS

A Great Industry Successfully Inaugurated at Deloro.

Prof. Warren of Syracuse, N.Y., who has lately returned from a visit to London, Eng., and Mr. John McFee of this city, have just returned from a visit to North Hustings mineral lands. While at Deloro they saw the starting of the new arsenic furnaces of the Canadian Gold Flelds Company and were greatly pleased with them. In conversation with a Sun reporter, Mr. McFee said that the arsenic was being properly sublimated for the first time in this Province, and that the plant there-would turn out three tons of refined or commercial arsenic per day. He says that the supply of crude material is unlimited, and, as this is but a by-product of gold ore, it means a lot to the county.

This is, he states, the only place in America in which arsenic can be procured in commercial quantities, and the company are using every effort to make use of the material at hand. As to the gold output, Mr. McFee had nothing to say at present.—Belleville Sun. augurated at Deloro.
