

A Well Known Irishman.

Patrick Donahoe, the venerable founder of The Pilot, and the most widely-known Irish-American of his day, passed away at his residence in Boston, Mass., at 1 o'clock on the morning of March 18, one hour after completing his 90th year. He was born in Munnery, Ireland, in 1811. His eldest daughter, Mary Eliza, was the first wife of the late Patrick Hughes of Toronto, and two of his grandchildren now reside in this city. Mr. Donahoe was known as the "veteran editor of the United States," being the oldest newspaper man in America. He founded The Pilot in 1832. A man of great charity, the splendid home in Boston for destitute Catholic children was built largely thru his generosity. In 1893 he was presented with the Laetare Medal, in recognition of his services to his religion and his country.
