EMPLOYERS AND DOCTORS.

New Government Regulations Concerning Unorganized Districts.

By a recent order in council the regulations governing the sanitary control of unorganized districts have been amended.

It is now necessary for employers of labor in these districts to send the name of the physician employed to the Provincial Board of Health. In cases where the board consider that any physician employed is situated at so great a distance from the camp as not to serve the interests of the employees properly, they may compel the employer to contract with some other physician residing closer.

It is also provided that where employees have been to extra expense for medical service on account of the physician being too far away the physician and employer shall be held responsible for the payment of a reasonable fee for such medical services.

DESOUNDING MOB LAW.

NO TROUBLE EXPECTED BUT RAILWAY MUST WAIT

Siding Into Exhibition Grounds Can. not Cross Dufferin-St. Until Formally Sanctioned.

Upon the assumption that the Board of Control's report would be adopted in Council on Monday, the Grand Trunk Company has gone ahead with the construction of the siding at the Exhibition grounds, which is proposed to cross Dufferin-street to the north of the existing crossing.

Acting Mayor S. W. Burns wrote the company yesterday, however, that they must not proceed to cross the street until the Council does pass upon the matter. The City Engineer was also instructed to see that the work was not carried out, and he has the assurance of the company that nothing will be done contrary to the wishes of the Council.

Ald. Burns has an idea, whereby the radial lines can be brought into the city without the necessity of crossing the Grand Trunk tracks at the Sunnyside. He proposes to run the radial cars along the north shore of the lake thru Parkdale and down to Bathurst-street, and then to build a lake shore boulevard drive from Bathurst-street thru to High Park.

The committee which was appointed to report upon the advisability of the drive will look into the matter of the railway at the same time and make a joint report.
