LIVE STOCK MARKET

There was a steady demand for the better class of cattle out at the Union Stock Yards yesterday, Good butcher cows held steady, while bredty steckers and feeders were in fair demand.

Off-color cattle are lower, and the general trend of the market was easier, with a slight shading off from Monday and Tuesday's sharp decline. There was some enquiry for choice heavy steers but there were none on the market. Choice quality butcher cattle met with a fair demand. As stated good, breedy stockers and feeders, showing quality, are in demand, and large numbers of them are being received and reshipped, mostly to Ontario country points.

Milkers and springers are selling well all the time. A fair average price would be between \$90 and \$125, but as high as \$140 and \$155 has been paid for extra choice animals.

Sheep are casier and lower from 25c to 50c. Calves trade was reported as fairly steady.

Hogs.

Hogs recovered their loss to some extent and were quoted on the market yestent and were quoted on the market yesterday at \$18, fed and watered, closing firm at that price. In one case at least \$18.10 was paid.

Receipts were 126 cars—2235 cattle, 158 calves, 712 noge and 1725 sheep and lambs.

The feature of the trade continues to be the active demand from buyers for cattle, lambs and calves for shipment to the United States, there being fully 40 carloads shipped out to different points this week so far, of which the bulk were lambs and calves, as only three care of cattle were shipped to Boston. A few choice steers sold at \$10.50; good at \$2.75 to \$10, and the lower grades from that down to \$8, while butchers' cows brought from \$6.50 to \$8.50, and bulls from \$7.85 to \$9 per cwt. The demand from packers for cattle for canning purposes was good and sales of bulls were made at \$6 to \$6.25 and cows at \$5 to \$5.25 per cwt.

There was a keen demand for lambs and an active trade was done at very firm prices Ontario stock sold at \$14.75 to \$15.25 and Quebec at \$13.50 to \$14.50, while sheep brought from \$8.50 to \$10 per cwt.. as to quality. Choice milk-fed stock sold at \$14 to \$15 per cwt, and lower grades teiween \$9 and \$13.

In sympathy with the decline in prices for hogs at other Canadian centres an easier feeling prevailed in the local market today and prices in some cases were 50 cents per cwt. lower, the range for selected lots being from \$17.50 to \$18 per cwt. cff cars.
